Initial situation	Before the Christmas vacations, there are "report cards" (assessment of the child's development) in Haiti, even in kindergarten. The first term of the school year is over. A small Christmas celebration is to be held at the Lumière Kindergarten. Groups of children sing and recite poems. Often they also present little plays. Everything is decorated beautifully. This year the management wants to show a film about the birth of Jesus. Gifts are passed around and the "report cards". Of course, a little something to eat and drink is very important. "Pate" is a traditional small puff pastry that is eaten especially at Christmas.
Project objectives	This project aims to achieve the following objectives: 1. reflection on Christmas 2. incentive for the children to learn and prepare 3. encouragement and respect for parents and children
Delimitations	Only for the kindergarten (children and their families, guest teachers and staff)
Milestones	Children prepare the various presentations, Obtaining gifts, aking Christmas cookies with the older children and putting them in baggies.
Dates	Before Christmas at the beginning of the vacation.
Costs	Food: Pate each H\$ 20 x 550 people = approx. € 410 Drinks: ca. 470 € Miscellaneous: 270 € Total for one school year: 1150 € ("pate" could be doubled, i.e.two small pieces)
Personnel expenses	The directrice will guide throughmoderate the program. All the staff from the Lumière kindergarten, professionals for the film (set-up, dismounting, execution), transport of drinks and food.
